

Tyler Sieh

A native of Minnesota, Sieh studied with Thomas Turner of the Minnesota Orchestra before attending the Cleveland Institute of Music where he studied with Mark Jackobs and Lynne Ramsey.

Formerly, Sieh was associate principal second violist for the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra and a member of the Augustana String Quartet. He also has been a substitute member of the Toledo Symphony Orchestra, Akron Symphony, and the Erie Philharmonic while also serving as the principal viola of the Ashland Symphony Orchestra. In addition, Tyler has performed with the National Gallery Orchestra, the Dominion Symphony Orchestra, the Ars Nova Chamber Ensemble, and is a founding member of the Oleana Chamber Players.

Sieh has appeared in recital at the Kennedy Center and is an alumnus of the ENCORE School for Strings, the Kent Blossom Music Festival and the Round Top International Festival-Institute where he had the opportunity to perform in recital with members of the Minnesota and San Francisco Orchestras, the faculty of the Juilliard School, and Rice University's Shepherd School of Music.
