

Cellist Julianne Boren has been performing and teaching privately for over 20 years. She holds a Master of Music degree from DePaul University in Chicago and a Bachelor of Music degree from Wichita State University in Wichita, KS. She is currently assistant principal cellist in the Minot Symphony and cellist of the Northern Lights String Quartet. She has also played for the Western Plains Opera, Bismarck-Mandan Symphony, and the Missouri Valley Chamber Orchestra. Prior to moving to North Dakota, Julianne held posts with the Lawrence (KS) Chamber Orchestra, St. Joseph (MO) Symphony, and Topeka (KS) Symphony and also played with the Wichita (KS) Symphony. As a member of the Orenunn Trio, she performed in six states as well as abroad in South Korea and Thailand. She has also taught at Baker University, the K.C. Strings Conservatory, and Minot State University. She has been on the faculty of the International Music Camp since 2003, and she taught at the K.C. Strings Summer Music Camp in 2007 and 2008 as a founding member of the camp. Currently, she is a private teacher to many cello, piano, and violin students in Minot. Her principal teachers were Christopher Costanza, David Schepps, Eleonore Schoenfeld, and Pamela Frame as well as orchestral excerpt studies with Katinka Kleijn and Stephen Balderston.
