The **INTERNATIONAL MUSIC CAMP**, held each summer at the International Peace Garden, is recognized as one of the leading Summer Schools of Fine Arts in North America. This unique international cultural center includes instruction, performances, and exhibitions in all areas of the fine arts for both students and adults. A staff of 150 internationally noted artist-teachers, guest conductors, and specialists provide the instruction and supervision of the camp programs. Over 2,000 students from various parts of North and South America, Europe, Asia, Australia, and the Middle East take part in the annual summer fine arts programs.

JANE CORY began classical violin lessons at the age of five, and discovered fiddle music at the age of seven. She has gone on to perform at countless events with styles such as Old Time, Celtic, French Canadian, Métis, Ottawa Valley, Jazz, and Bluegrass.

Jane has collaborated on several studio albums, and in 2014 released her first solo album

Road Between the Saints. Along with her busy teaching and performing schedule, she has also competed in numerous competitions across Canada. In 2018, Jane became the second Manitoban to win first place at the Canadian Grand Masters Fiddling Competition, the most prestigious fiddle competition in the country. Jane graduated in 2018 with a Bachelor of Music performance degree.

THE ROYAL CANADIAN AIR FORCE BAND is a group of thirty-five full time professional musicians who routinely perform throughout Canada. Comprised of a number of diverse groups and ensembles, the Band's role is to provide musical support to the Canadian Forces, all levels of government, and to a variety of public functions. The Royal Canadian Air Force Band also proudly represents Canada and the Canadian Forces around the globe. Military and public parades, ceremonial occasions, international tattoos, public and school concerts, official dinners, dances and receptions are all typical engagements for the Royal Canadian Air Force Band and its varied ensembles.

In 2009 the Band embarked on an extensive and exciting musical restructuring that greatly enhanced its repertoire and relevance to better appeal to audiences of all ages. The versatility of the new Royal Canadian Air Force Band is readily evident through the number and variety of its groups and ensembles: Jet Stream (show band), Command Brass (brass quintet), Dixieland Band, Jazz Combos, JetLiners (Jazz Big band), and of course, Parade Band.

For over sixty years, this professional Air Force Band has been highly visible throughout the Canadian Forces. Instilling national pride in Canadian audiences across the country, it is also a key contributor to "esprit de corps" in our military. The Royal Canadian Air Force Band proudly represents Canada at international events around the globe, bringing with it the highest degree of diplomacy and statesmanship.

The Royal Canadian Air Force Band is based out of 17 Wing, Winnipeg and is presently under the command of Captain Matthew Clark, CD. Made up of nine performers who represent a cross-section of the Winnipeg music and theatre community, **THOSE GUYS** have built a reputation for dynamic, feel-good performances. Their repertoire, which ranges from Billy Joel to Bruno Mars, features complex (often original) musical arrangements performed without a single instrument. Those

Guys have released three albums, "That Album" (2012), "Live!" (2014), and "This Christmas" (2015). In 2016, Those Guys had the honour of opening for The Nylons during their Farewell Tour.

The International Music Camp presents the **IMC JAZZ FACULTY BIG BAND**. This 20-piece big band is comprised of some of the finest artist-teachers and clinicians in North America. The band will entertain you with an evening of easy listening

from the big band era through the modern jazz of today.

JULY 26 & 27

THE NATIONAL YOUTH WIND ORCHESTRA LUXEMBOURG (NYWOL) is an organization of the Music School of the National Music Federation of Luxembourg "Union Grand-Duc Adolphe" (UGDA), which meets every year for a working session and concert tour in a different country. The aims of the orchestra are to support the musical education



of young musicians from Luxembourg, to promote a varied repertoire for wind orchestra, especially works written by Luxembourg and European composers, as well as to promote youth exchanges between different countries. The orchestra is conducted by professional conductors and tutors from Luxembourg and abroad.

This ensemble is composed of young musicians aged between 14 and 20 coming from various conservatories, music schools, and music associations of Luxembourg; it includes prize winners from the "Luxembourg Competition for Young Soloists". The orchestra is composed of 58 young musicians aged 14 to 20 years and a staff of 12 professional musicians and counsellors. The conductor of the orchestra is François Schammo, principal horn of the military band of Luxembourg and teacher at the UGDA Music School.

The UGDA Music School is responsible for public music education in 56 municipalities of Luxembourg (with 5.700 students). It also organizes numerous extracurricular activities on the local, regional, national, European, and international level such as training and development workshops as well as bilateral and multilateral exchanges in collaboration with other cultural or youth organizations, notably the Service National de la Jeunesse (national youth service).

Since the 1970s the International Music Camp invites young musicians from Luxembourg to attend IMC every year. Also, UGDA hosted in 2014 and 2018 different youth ensembles of Blue Lake. On invitation of Blue Lake International Exchange program the NYWOL toured in 2015 in the US in Illinois, Michigan, and Wisconsin.

JULY 30

The **FINALE SHOWCASE CONCERTS**—featuring World Percussion, Community Bands, Choir, Orchestras, Barbershop Choirs, Harp, Brass Band, and Handbells—will close out the 64th season of the International Music Camp. You won't want to skip this evening of fun and entertainment with our adult musicians! Concerts begin at 4:00 and 7:00 p.m. in the Burdick Center for the Performing Arts.
