Arlene is a Saskatchewan Based Horn teacher and musician. She has been teaching Horn in the Saskatoon Area for over 20 years. Her hometown is North Battleford, Saskatchewan where she participated in many local community groups such as the City Kinsmen Band and the Battlefords Concert Band. Arlene graduated from the University of Saskatchewan with a B. Mus. Mus. Ed in 1986. She taught Band for the next 14 years. In 2000 she shifted her focus to teaching Horn and becoming the Horn Instructor at the University of Saskatchewan.

Arlene has created an active horn community in Saskatoon. She conducts the Saskatoon Horn Choir and the Saskatoon Junior Horn Choir. The Saskatoon Horn choir was created in 2002 for her university students and it grew to include members of all the Adult bands and orchestras in Saskatoon. Her current horn studio is over 30 students, representing both school divisions in Saskatoon, Outlook and Adult brass players. Many of Arlene's students have gone on to study Music or have continued to play for fun once they finish high school.

She is also in demand as a horn clinician for provincial honour bands and school sectionals. She has presented workshops at the Saskatchewan Music conferences and published articles for the Saskatchewan Band Association.
