He has been a member of numerous ensembles including the DePaul Concert Orchestra, DePaul Trombone Choir, UND Trombone Quartet, the North Dakota Trombone Choir, GGFSO, and UND Wind Ensemble. He has received the UND Department of Music Award for Outstanding Achievement in Brass Performance for three consecutive years during his undergraduate.

Paul has performed solos with the UND Wind Ensemble, BMSO, Minot City Band, Brass Band of Minot, and the GGFSO. He has also successfully given a sophomore, junior, senior, and a graduate recital. After his masters, he toured with The King's Brass in 2020-21 and received a great variety of performance experience while traveling coast to coast. In the summer of 2018, he attended the MasterWorks Festival in South Carolina where he played many orchestral standards.
