

Faith Colobong is a dedicated trombonist and music educator based in Winnipeg, MB. Her passion for music, learning, and people has driven her to pursue music education and all of its possibilities. Faith has recently graduated from Brandon University School of Music in May 2024, completing the rigorous 5-year Concurrent Bachelor of Music/Bachelor of Education (After Degree) program specializing in Instrumental Music. Currently, Faith is teaching Kindergarten through Grade 12 Music at Morris School.

Her musical journey includes Classical Piano studies through the Royal Conservatory of Music under the tutelage of Maura Doyle for nearly a decade. She has also had the privilege to further her trombone studies with Dr. Nora Wilson and Joel Green, as well as further her jazz studies with Greg Gatien, Diogo Peixoto, Eric Platz, Ken Gold, Dr. Matthew Steckler, and Marika Galea.

Faith actively performs with groups like the Winnipeg Jazz Orchestra, having performed with them since their inaugural International Women's Day concert in March 2022. She also performs with N.Y.O.H., a dynamic nine-piece ensemble known for their diverse repertoire spanning R&B, hip-hop, funk, fusion, Latin, and swing. Additionally, she contributes to Sol Frnds, an eight-piece jazz collective celebrated for their original compositions and arrangements rooted in Black-American music traditions and eclectic influences.
