

Garage Band at IMC



Students in the Garage Band Program are asked to bring the following materials with them to camp, primarily for use in the huts where you practice with your band:

Guitarists & Bassists need to bring their own instruments, amps, tuners, cables and a heavy-duty extension cord. If you have a pedal board that requires a power strip, then bring that along. Guitarists must bring an extra set of strings and any accessories that they need to succeed - picks, capo, slide, batteries for active pickups, etc. Guitarists and Bassists who plan on getting their instrument adjusted and “set up” by the IMC Guitar Tech will need a spare set of strings. This service is free and highly recommended.

Drummers need their own drum kit, drum stool, sticks and any tools required to keep the drums in working order.

Keyboard players need their own keyboard, amp, cables and heavy-duty extension cord.

One microphone, mic stand, and monitor will be supplied to each band. Students are welcome to bring their own Mics, Cables, and Mic Stands if they have them. These should be clearly marked. **IMC is not responsible for loss or theft.**

All students must bring earplugs. Musician’s ear plugs are recommended; foam ear plugs will do - bring some extras in case of loss. The use of ear plugs is MANDATORY when practicing and performing with your band. Students are welcome to bring a music-playing device for rehearsal purposes. If possible, please bring a speaker for said device as well. The camp has some small speakers available, but technology changes quickly - most of the IMC speakers require cables to plug the device in, while modern devices tend to use Bluetooth exclusively.

A \$30 USD user fee is included in the cost of tuition to cover the use of camp owned equipment- the IMC provides guitar and bass amps, a drum kit and a PA system for the main performances.
